## Positive Animal Rabies Case

This is the 3<sup>rd</sup> case for Kerr County in 2016

Animal Submitted: Skunk

Date of Incident 01/16/2016

Where: Kerr County – 100 Block of Oak Haven, Mountain Home

How: Saturday January 16, 2016, a resident observed a skunk being attacked by their dogs in the back yard. Kerr County Animal Services the Local Rabies Control Authority was notified and received the skunk. The skunk was sent for testing on January 20, 2016. Positive rabies results were received Friday January 22, 2016. Two dogs were exposed both are current on their Rabies vaccination the other; however, as required by state law a 45 day isolation period for both vaccinated animals must be observed to ensure their safety as well as the safety of the owners and the public's health & safety.

Do not attempt to feed or make contact with wildlife or stray cats and dogs.
