Positive Animal Rabies Case

This is the 2nd case for Kerr County in 2016

Animal Submitted: Raccoon

Date of Incident 01/20/2016

Where: Kerr County – 100 Block of Birch Drive, Kerrville

How: Wednesday January 20, 2016, a resident noticed a deceased raccoon on their property which had not been there earlier in the morning. Kerr County Animal Services the Local Rabies Control Authority was notified and received the raccoon. There was no known pet contact. The raccoon was sent for testing on January 20, 2016. Positive rabies results were received Friday January 22, 2016. Although there was no known pet exposure there are feral cats in the area. It is strongly advised, if you are feeding any cats or dogs, you have vaccinated them for rabies. It is a violation of the law if you do not do so.

**You never know when a wild animal will visit.
Make sure to keep your pets vaccinated against rabies.
Do not attempt to feed or make contact with wildlife or stray cats and dogs.
