## Positive Animal Rabies Case

This is the 23<sup>rd</sup> case for Kerr County in 2016

Animal Submitted: Raccoon

Date of Incident 05/21/2016

Where: 100 Block of Twin Springs Drive, Kerrville

How: A resident was alerted to a raccoon by their dog in the early morning; Kerr County Animal Services the Local Rabies Control Authority was notified and dispatched the raccoon. There may have been possible pet contact. The raccoon was sent for testing on May 23, 2016. Positive rabies results were received May 25, 2016. As required by state law a 45 day isolation period for the vaccinated dog must be observed to ensure its safety as well as the health & safety of the owner and public.

**You never know when a wild animal will visit.  
Make sure to keep your pets vaccinated against rabies.  
Do not attempt to feed or make contact with wildlife or stray cats and dogs.
