## Positive Animal Rabies Case

This is the 31<sup>st</sup> case for Kerr County in 2016

Animal Submitted: Bat

Date of Incident: 09/16/2016

Where: 200 Block of Highway 39, Ingram

How: A volunteer firefighter observed a deceased bat on the ground inside the fire station. The employee then notified Kerr County Animal Services the Local Rabies Control Authority. The bat was contained and submitted for testing on 09/19/2016. The positive results were received 09/20/2016. There was no known contact with the facility's vaccinated pet. For the health and safety of the fire station and their pet, a 45 day observation period and rabies booster will be advised for the cat.

**You never know when a wild animal will visit.  
Make sure to keep your pets vaccinated against rabies.  
Do not attempt to feed or make contact with wildlife or stray cats and dogs.
